### EXHIBIT CHECKLIST – Use this checklist to prepare for the exhibit.

- 1. Spread the word about the exhibit.** Make sure to invite your friends, co-workers, neighbors and acquaintances. Even if they don't do needle arts they can still enjoy the beauty of our handwork. The majority of exhibit attendees are those who have received a personal invitation.
- 2. Accept the Name Tag Challenge.** Make a new one or locate your favorite to wear at the exhibit.
- 3. Finish your projects.** Now is the time to get your stitching done and prepare your pieces for display. Be creative with your finishing choices — finishing does not have to be expensive to be effective.
- 4. Submit your entry forms.** Choose the format that suits you best — enter online directly, download a form, or pick up a printed form from meeting leaders at March and April meetings.
- 5. Collect items for the Needlework Closet.** Take the time to thin out your stash and donate items you no longer need to the Needlework Closet.
- 6. Continue to spread the word (and flyers).** Flyers are available at all meetings or contact Ann Cohan directly. You can also download the PDF from our website to print copies or email it to your friends.
- 7. Volunteer your time and energy.** Many hands are needed to pull together the exhibit. Consider volunteering to help with set up or clean up, be a hostess or assist at the Needlework Closet.
- 8. Save the Date for the Preview Party.** Plan to enjoy the Members Preview Party and a chance to shop at the Needlework closet before the exhibit officially opens.

Celebrate your talents and love of needlework by exhibiting in Artistry in Stitches 2019. Our goal is to show at least one item from each member. Be an active part of our EGA community— stitched together by the love of needlearts.

## Letter from the President

### Artistry in Stitches

May 16-19, 2019  
Carondelet Hospitality Center

Hello Everyone,  
Let's talk exhibit...

The Exhibit Committee is already working on planning this year's event from registration to receiving, from setting up displays to hosting, and from pricing Needlework Closet inventory to selling that inventory. They're working on the preview party, arranging demonstrations, creating a memorial display, and developing a media campaign. One of the biggest endeavors this year will be an on-line registration feature as an alternative to the paper registration we've used in the past. The paper registration will still be available for this exhibit, but utilizing the on-line version will really streamline the process. I've had the opportunity to try it out, and it worked very well. There will be many opportunities for you to help make our exhibit a success, and I encourage you to help if asked, and volunteer if you see a need.

I've learned that we never have more than 50% of our members submit their work for display. We can do better than that! I ask every member to consider submitting a piece of their embroidery for display this year. If you haven't finished something recently, consider submitting something from a previous exhibit. Our rules state that if something hasn't been exhibited in the past ten years, it may be used again now. And to our new members, please submit pieces of your work previously done if you have nothing that you're working on now. Also, remember, the registration fee of \$5 is waived for first-time exhibitors. For all other members, the registration fee remains at \$5.

I'd like to mention something that is important: **Nametags**. As you know, it is our policy to require nametags be worn at our meetings, and it is especially important to wear one whenever you are at the exhibit so that visitors will know that you are a member and would be an appropriate person to approach with questions or comments.

There is lots of information contained within this newsletter regarding our exhibit; I hope you will read it all and keep this issue available for handy reference purposes. The registration process will begin very soon. If you're working on a piece and are not sure if you'll have it ready for the exhibit, *register that piece*. It's quite simple to eliminate the registration if necessary if you don't submit the piece, but impossible to add to the registration if it is not submitted before the deadline.

I plan to spend the next few weeks finishing some projects that I've set aside for one reason or another so that they'll be ready in time to submit them to *Artistry in Stitches*. Please join me.

## June Retreat

For a second year we are offering two retreat packages for members and friends, the new four-day, three-night option, and our traditional three-day, two-night retreat.

For those of you unfamiliar with the retreat, please ask any of us who have been going for many years how wonderful it is to just sit and stitch and not worry about making beds, cooking, or cleaning. Our stitching room has incredible daylight, with huge windows on both sides of the very large room. We sit at our tables in one part of this space, and when the breakfast, lunch or dinner bell rings, we just get up and move to a different part of the room. And I have to tell you the food is wonderful. Paul Ventura, the chef and facility manager, makes delicious meals with lots of variety and choice. And he is usually able to accommodate anyone with special dietary requests.

The site itself is simply beautiful, with a view of the Catskill Mountains. It is a wonderful place to walk around, and depending on the weather, there is a tennis court and outdoor pool. The main residence has a large, central living room with a television and DVD player.

**Dates:** The retreat dates are June 6–9 for those who select the four-day option, and June 7–9 for the three-day retreat.

Breakfast and lunch are served on Sunday and the retreat will end at 3:00 PM.

## Needlework Closet Donations

Donations of new or gently used needlework-related items are now being accepted for sale at our Artistry in Stitches exhibit in May. Funds raised at the Needlework Closet help our chapter offer special events like workshops with national teachers and outreach projects such as our Creative Stitches program.

I will collect donations at every Beverwyck meeting from now until May. Members who attend Day Group or North End meetings may contact me directly, or could ask a member who attends Beverwyck meetings to bring their donations to me there. Helen O'Connor will not be collecting donations at meetings, but you may arrange a time with Helen to bring your items to her house, where donations are being stored; please carry them from your car to the basement storage area.

The Needlework Closet committee would appreciate it very much if you follow these guidelines:

- ✗ Put complete kits (directions, fabric, and threads) in a plastic bag, and label them "complete kit."
- ✗ Place stitching fabric in a plastic bag and identify size of piece, thread count, and type of fabric, if known.
- ✗ Place threads in a plastic bag and label them.
- ✗ If more than one skein of yarn, package together and identify type if there is no label.
- ✗ Roll sewing fabrics and wrap a paper band around the roll. Write type of fabric and measurements on the band (100% cotton, 45" w. 2 1/3 yards).

NOTE: We can accept only quilting fabrics!

- ✗ Charts, complete patterns and books related to stitching are welcome, as are stitching and sewing tools and notions, hoops, and frames.

*Please do not donate unrelated craft items as they do not sell.*




