## 2020 Winter Retreat

Our winter retreat will be held January 24, 25 and 26, 2020, at the St. Joseph Carondelet Hospitality Center in Latham from 10:00 AM on Friday to 4:00 PM on Sunday. Registrants will be able to come for the whole weekend or to be a day tripper for one, two or all three days. There are two options if you would like to come as a day tripper on Friday and Saturday. **Option #1** for people who want to come for the day and noon meal but do not want to stay for the evening meal and evening stitching. **Option #2** for people who want to come for the day and evening stitching and take part in the noon AND evening meals. There is only one option for Sunday day trippers since the retreat ends on Sunday and only the noon meal is served.

We will be stitching in the area where we hold our biennial exhibit. You will be able to set up your work stations and leave them in place overnight in a secured area. The tables are large and round, easily accommodating four or five stitchers with their lights, etc. The chairs are padded and very comfortable and the room has great lighting. There is also a lounge area and kitchen with microwave and refrigerator for times when you want to take a break. The sleeping rooms are single occupancy with bathrooms on the hall. Even so, the bathrooms afford privacy with "closets" (full length doors) and each "closet" has a toilet and a sink.

### RATES

#### Weekender - \$250

Includes three full days of stitching: dinner on Friday; breakfast, dinner and supper on Saturday; and breakfast and noon dinner on Sunday.

#### Friday Noon Meal - \$13

This fee is for weekenders only who would like to partake in the noon meal on Friday.

#### Day Trippers

- **OPTION #1 Friday \$26.50:** includes noon meal & daytime stitching.  
**Saturday \$32.00:** includes noon meal & daytime stitching.
- **OPTION #2 Friday \$45.00:** includes noon & dinner meals and day & evening stitching.  
**Saturday \$45.00:** includes noon & dinner meals and day & evening stitching.
- **Sunday \$32.00:** includes stitching until 4:00 and noon meal.

The winter retreat is a wonderful opportunity for members to get together to stitch and share our love for stitching in a warm, welcoming atmosphere during the winter months. I hope to see many of you there.



This year's Service Project will be stitching new ornaments for the Beverwyck Christmas tree that we set up each year as a thank you for the use of their meeting room. The decorated tree is placed near the main lobby and is warmly received by both residents and staff.

Many of the ornaments are showing their age so it is time to freshen up the collection. Patterns, fabric and threads will be available at all group meetings during the month of January. No need to sign up. Just bring your basic stitching supplies: needles, scissors, hoop and magnifier if needed.

## Basics of Crewel and Surface Embroidery with Maggie Oldendorf

Beverwyck – Tuesday, February 18

Day Group – Wednesday, February 19

North End – Thursday, March 5

Do you like the crewel and surface embroidery that others have stitched, but been hesitant to try it yourself? Or have you done crewel or surface stitching in the past but need a refresher? Then join us for our upcoming Basics of Crewel and Surface Embroidery class. We will stitch a small, graceful floral design on linen using Appleton crewel wool (the same techniques apply to surface embroidery with other threads). Basic stitches such as stem/outline, chain, satin, French knots, fly, and long and short stitch will be covered. (Yes, you CAN do long and short stitch!)

We have plenty of Appleton wool, so you may select colors you like. Pre-traced linen, crewel wool, and needles will be provided; you need only bring a 6-inch hoop, scissors, a threader, and your willingness to learn!

**Registration:** This class is free, but you need to sign up so we can have a kit ready for you. There is a limit of 10 participants per class. Use the coupon on page 10 to register by the deadline, Friday, February 7.





# MORE PROGRAMS

## Beginning Blackwork Bookmark with Terry Case

Day Group – Wednesday, April 15

Beverwyck – Tuesday, April 21

North End – Thursday, April 23

Blackwork is a counted thread technique worked on an even-weave fabric. Simple stitches — double running and back stitch — are used to create the patterns. If you have ever been curious about blackwork but were intimidated by the intricate patterns involved, this bookmark project may be of interest.

This class is one of the many Petit Projects offered by EGA. It starts with a double running band and progresses through two additional slightly more complex bands. The pathway for each band is charted. An initial personalizes the project. Finishing is a very simple nun stitch with fringe.

The \$5 class fee includes 28 ct lugana fabric and DMC floss. Students need to bring a 24 or 26 tapestry needle, a small hoop, scissors and magnification if needed.

**Registration:** Class size will be limited to 10 students per group. Use the coupon on page 10 to send in your \$5 by the deadline, Tuesday, April 7.



## Dragonfly on Waterlily Pincushion with Sandie Feck



Our May program will be Lorna Bateman’s “Dragonfly on Waterlily” pincushion. The class will be held at each of our three regular meeting locations and features a combination of surface embroidery and ribbon embroidery stitches.

The pincushion is stitched on a quality shot silk fabric using Chameleon Threads, silk ribbon, and beads. Everything you will need is included in the kit: ground fabric, threads, ribbon, beads, and an attractive hand-crafted wooden pincushion which measures approximately 3 ¼ inch in diameter and stands on three little round legs. Full stitching and assembly instructions are also provided. The kit fee will be approximately \$48.




