Talk on Swedish Embroidery by Pat Olski

Like many things this year, our Joint Meeting will be a little different since it will be held via Zoom. Though we'll miss our tradition of chatting over our picnic suppers, we encourage you to enjoy a hot beverage, and perhaps a dessert, in the comfort of your own home as you settle in to enjoy the Zoom meeting.

We are pleased to welcome Pat Olski as our featured speaker for a talk on the *History of Swedish Long Arm Embroidery*. Pat is a professional needlecraft designer, lecturer, and instructor. Her designs and articles, which span an array of topics from traditional needlework techniques to current knitwear trends, have appeared in many books and magazines including *Piecework, Vogue Knitting, Knit Simple*, and Australia's *Inspirations*. She loves to teach, and has taught classes in knitting, crocheting, embroidery, and Dorset button making for years at events such as Vogue Knitting Live and Knitters Day Out, as well as at museums, guilds, libraries, and schools. She is the author of eight yarn craft books including *Dishcloths to Crochet: Fun Designs to Brighten Your Kitchen!* (Dover–April 2018).

Beginning Blackwork Bookmark with Terry Case

Blackwork is a counted thread technique worked on an even-weave fabric. Simple stitches — double running and back stitch — are used to create the patterns.

This class is one of the many Petit Projects offered by EGA. It starts with a double running band and progresses through two additional slightly more complex bands. The pathway for each band is charted. An initial personalizes the project. Finishing is a very simple nun stitch with fringe.

The \$7.50 class fee includes a kit with Lugana fabric, DMC floss and easy-to-read instructions. Students will need a 24 or 26 tapestry needle, a small hoop, scissors and magnification if needed. Registered students will receive the kit by mail.

Registration deadline is September 25. Class size will be limited to 10 students per group. Registration coupon is on page 8.

Sandie Feck will demonstrate silk ribbon embroidery for those members that have purchased and received Lorna Bateman's "Dragonfly on Waterlily" pincushion kit. The kit includes everything needed for the project: ground fabric, threads, ribbon, beads, needles, wooden pincushion, and full stitching and assembly instructions.

Participants will need a 6" hoop, scissors, light and magnification if needed. Meeting link will be emailed to all students before the meeting.



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Let's Meet – via Zoom That Is!

By now there probably isn't anyone on the planet who hasn't heard about Zoom. But, while everyone has heard about it, not everyone is "Zooming" along.

What exactly is Zoom? How do I get started? How do I join a meeting? Can everyone see me? How come I can't see anyone. Can you hear me? Who else is on the call? Those are just some of the questions that might stop you from meeting up with your friends and joining a stitch-in or an on-line class.

Take a deep breath, and repeat after me: "I can do this." "I can do this." "I can do this." "I can do this." "YES, I can do this!"

Zoom is a way to meet with others by using your computer/ device instead of being face-to-face.

You will need a computer, laptop, iPad, tablet or smart phone. Most of these devices come equipped with a video camera and microphone that you will use to "meet."

A Zoom invitation will come to you from the "host" (the person initiating the call/meeting) through your email with a "link" to the call. In order to use Zoom, the App/Client needs to be downloaded to your device.

The first time you click on a Zoom invitation link from your computer/laptop, the Zoom Client will automatically download and will be there for the current call and all links to calls in the future. For smart phones and other devices you will need to download the app—just like you would download any other app (games, The Weather Channel, Facebook, etc.).

Depending on the computer/device you are using, control panels are available at the top, bottom or side, of your screen for turning on your video/voice controls, viewing other members on the call and other options. You may need to move your mouse over these areas for the panels to appear. You can choose to view others in different modes (gallery mode where you can see each person on the call, view the names of those on the call, etc.). The panel will also allow you to "chat" to others on the call, turn off your camera, mute yourself, leave the meeting, etc. Remember, everyone can see and hear you and anyone else within range of your computer/device, so turn off your camera or mute yourself so that others on the call are not distracted by a phone ringing, family members speaking, etc. Only one person can "speak" at a time on Zoom so if your dog is barking in the background, no one else can speak!

A printout of Basic Zoom features was made available to all Metropolitan Region members via Groups.io several months ago.
