The Changing of the Dues

his year brings two big changes to our annual dues: a cost increase and a new payment method. Let's start by looking at the cost increase.

In the September 2023 issue of *Needle Arts*, EGA President Karen Hamilton wrote about national dues increasing to \$55 in 2024. This is the first increase in 14 years and comes at a time when EGA has been operating at a deficit for several years. In our last newsletter, Chapter President Nancy Knowles explained that not all of our \$60 annual membership dues stays with our Chapter. Membership dues are shared between national (\$39), the Metropolitan Region (\$4) and our Chapter (\$17). With national dues increasing to \$55, our annual membership dues will now be \$76.

If you read the 2/1/24 email from EGA Headquarters, you already know about the second big change. EGA will now email renewal reminders to all members. Chapter members will then go to https://egausa.org to renew their membership. Payment of dues may be made by credit card, Apple Pay or Google Pay. Additional payment options may be available when we receive the final membership renewal instructions. Many members will like the ease of the new approach and appreciate not worrying about stolen checks and check washing. But some members may struggle with the new approach. If you have concerns, reach out to your group leader for assistance. If you are still unable to renew and pay online, you may request a form to renew and pay by mail. While this is not the preferred way to renew, it may be the only option for some members.

The annual renewal date for current members will remain as 5/31 while the renewal date for new members will be the last day of the month they join. Kick off for the annual renewal of current EGA members will be April 1, 2024. Please **do not** renew your membership prior to April 1 as it may not be processed correctly. Our goal is to have all members renew by 5/15. Previous grace periods beyond 5/31 will no longer be accepted because a computer is creating the cutoff date, not a person. If you renew your membership after 5/31, you will have to enroll as a new member. This new online process applies only to **primary** chapter members. If you are a plural member, you will still need to send me \$17 for your NYCDCEGA dues.

As the 2/16/24 email from EGA Headquarters suggests, now is the time to make sure you're ready for membership renewal. If you haven't been to the national <u>EGA website</u> recently, please log in to make sure your user name and login still work. If they do, you are ready to go when the time comes to renew your membership. If you can't log in or have never been to the Members Only section of the EGA website, please follow the information <u>here</u> to set up your password and login. If you have difficulties with the process, email National at <u>egahq@ egausa.org</u> or call 502-589-6956.

Details of the new renewal process are still being worked out so Chapter members should carefully read ALL emails from EGA Headquarters. You can also find info on the Join Us page of egausa.org and the FAQs for Dues Renewals section. As we learn more, we'll send out emails and group leaders will share information at the monthly meetings. If you have concerns or questions, please reach out to me, your group leader or other Board members.

Beaded Ribbon Scissor Case Lanyard with Sandie Feck

Saturday, March 23, 2024

Save your needlework from scissor punctures or accidental snipping of threads by storing your scissors in this pretty little scissor case which is always at hand when worn around the neck. The scissor case is made using jacquard-style ribbon and embellished with a beaded trim. The case is worn around the neck on a 32" silk lanyard and will hold a pair of scissors up to 4" long.

The kit contains: ribbon, fleece, seed beads, large bead, cording, thread, needles, pins and instructions. You will have the opportunity to choose the ribbon you'd like to use. You bring scissors, magnification and lighting as needed, and your lunch.

Embroidered Birds with Natalie Hart Fryzer

Saturday, Apri 13, 2024

These three felt birds were originally designed for our Creative Stitching – Teaching Children to Stitch program. This was a fun project the kids enjoyed and is doable with only basic sewing skills. If the kids could do it, you can do it! Each bird uses a variety of embroidery stitches and instructions will cover tips for assembly.

Registration deadline is April 1. Class limit is 12 students so sign up early. The \$5 kit fee includes patterns, instructions, enough felt for three birds, one skein of DMC #5 pearl cotton, assorted print fabric for tail feathers and fiber fill. There will be an additional assortment of DMC colors to choose from, but feel free to bring your own threads. Pearl cotton #5 & #8 are best but you can also use stranded floss. You'll also need sharp needles, scissors and lunch. Use the registration coupon on page 9 to mail your check by April 1.

OUTREACH REPORT

Update on Sampler Reproduction Project

We are working with Sarah Stevens, the Peebles Island textile conservator, to reproduce an 1838 sampler from the Senate House State Historic Site in Kingston, NY. In January, a small group met at Peebles Island to examine the sampler and discuss the project. The majority of our time was spent trying to determine the original thread colors. The sampler is in fairly good condition despite its age, but the years have affected the colors. To see the most accurate color, we looked at the back and then found the best match to DMC floss. From that work, a key was developed with a symbol for each color.



We are now in the first phase of the project which involves charting the original. There are three teams of two that each meet one day a week. The work is moving slowly but steadily as we carefully examine the sampler, then refer to the key to add the appropriate symbols to graph paper. The sampler is stitched over two threads on 28 ct linen — except when it's over one! — and can be difficult to see clearly. But with the aid of our magnifying glass we are making progress.

June 2024 Retreat at Ararat Center

This year's retreat will include a four-day, three-night option. We haven't offered this since COVID put a pause on our retreats and we're very happy to be able to have this option once again.

Whether you stay with the three-day option or treat yourself to four days, this will be a wonderful weekend. It's always a treat to sit and stitch with friends and not worry about making beds, cooking, or cleaning. Our stitching room has incredible daylight, with huge windows on both sides of the very large room. We'll sit at our tables in one part of this space, and when the breakfast, lunch or dinner bell rings, we just get up and move to a different part of the room. The food is always extraordinary, and we are able to accommodate anyone with special dietary requests.

The site itself is simply beautiful, with a view of the Catskill Mountains and plenty of space to walk around and stretch your legs. If you need to stretch your arms and shoulders, Ann Cohan and Helen O'Connor will be leading morning and afternoon breaks with "Simple Stretches for Stitchers." Last summer, several members also shared their own stretches and gentle exercises. So if you have some favorite movements you want to share, we would love to try them out. If you need a stitching break in the evenings, the main residence has a large, central living room with a television and DVD player.

Dates: The retreat dates are Thursday, June 6 through Sunday, June 9.

Location: Ararat Center in Greenville, NY, just off Route 32, 18 miles south of Delmar.

Meals: The four-day option starts with dinner on Thursday, and includes all meals through lunch on Sunday. The meals for the three-day option start with dinner on Friday. Snacks will be served every evening. Coffee, tea, hot chocolate, juices and water are included and available throughout the day, often with fresh fruit. Breakfast and lunch are served on Sunday and the retreat will end at 3:00 pm Sunday.

Costs: The retreat costs include all meals and meal gratuities. Housekeeping gratuities are up to the individual participant.

- OPTION 1: Four-day Weekend, Thursday–Sunday \$451 for a single; \$361 for a double; and \$328 for a triple.
- OPTION 2: Three-day Weekend, Friday–Sunday \$306 for a single; \$246 for a double; and \$222 for a triple.

In order to hold this event, we must have full payment from 12 members for the three-day option and eight for the four-day by April 9. So please don't delay and send in the registration coupon on page 9 with your payment.

Registration for day trippers will open once we meet the minimum number of weekend attendees. At that point, I will send out an email with meal costs and other details.

- Awarded for in-depth research in all areas of embroidery and allied textile arts, and to create a basis for dialogue between EGA and other grant and research institutions.
- Grants of up to \$1,000 are awarded annually.

RSN (Royal School of Needlework)

The Stitch Bank

The RSN has been expanding its stitch encyclopedia, The Stitch Bank. The newest expansion is explained on their website: "This winter we are adding 25 stitches from the late sixteenth and early seventeenth centuries. For this we have been working with Jacqui Carey, author of *Sweet Bags and Elizabethan Stitches*. These include stitches from the period that have fallen out of use as well different ways of working familiar stitches." Some of the stitches included in this project are Elizabethan Plaited, Ladder, and Holly Braid Stitches, Elizabethan Tubular Ceylon, Elizabethan Half and Turn, and Elizabethan Corded Brussels.

Each of the over 350 stitches includes an overview of the stitch, detailed visual and video directions, visual examples, references, and three attributes that are searchable in their own right: the structure of the stitch, the use of the stitch, and the embroidery technique in which it is used.

 Security Tips for Writing Checks Have you seen the recent news reports about the incresase in check theft and check washing? In our last newsletter, Treasurer Jenni Paperman shared the story of how our Chapter fell victim to check washing, the steps she took to get our money back and protect our accounts, and tips on what we could do to avoid this in the future. Keep these tips in mind when you register for Chapter events: Use a black gel ink pen instead of a ballpoint pen to prevent check washing. Use a security envelope or wrap check in non-transparent paper to make sure the check cannot be seen. Go inside the post office to mail your check. Hand deliver check at a meeting when possible.
