Be ready to strike up a conversation and share a flyer with anyone who might be interested. Drop flyers at your favorite store, coffee shop, doctor's office, etc.
 - The main exhibit will be on the ground floor of Pat's Barn. The Needlework Closet will be on the 2nd floor along with the demonstrations. There is an elevator available for those who can't use the stairs.
- Save-the-Date Details are up on our website. Have friends check it out at <u>nycapega</u>. org to find out more about us. We will not only have members' work on display but will also have ongoing needlework demonstrations and items for sale at our Needlework Closet.
- The Needlework Closet. Now's the time to donate any unused items in your stash. Bring them to Chapter meetings so Maggie will have time to organize and price them. Refer to the Donations Guidelines on our website to see what's acceptable.
- ☐ Gift/Opportunity Baskets. Please consider donating new kits, threads, patterns and finished embroidery pieces. Contact Sandie Feck.
- Finish Your Projects. With only three months of time left, keep on stitching your projects and remember you'll need time for finishing and framing. There'll be a finishing class at the Day Group meeting on March 19 (details on page 5).
- Volunteers Needed. Helen O'Connor will need hostesses for all three days. (Time slots: 10-12 pm, 12-2 pm and 2-4 pm). Or consider volunteering to help with set up, intake and clean up. Help will also be needed with the reception and Needlework Closet. (*Details for volunteering jobs are on page 6.*)
- **Entry Forms.** The registration deadline is Thursday, April 24. Online registration is preferred and you can find the link and more information on page 6. Registrar Mary Willmott would like everyone to include a one-line personal note about each submission, but it isn't a requirement.

Day Group Meeting Wednesday, March 19 10 – 2 pm Need help finishing that special project for the Exhibit? We are here to help you!

During the Day Group meeting on March 19, we will demonstrate techniques that you may find useful for getting your pieces ready for the exhibit. We'll show you how to mount pieces if you wish to do your own framing. There will also be a demo on how to make cording that can be used to embellish puff pillows and other smaller pieces. If you have a small piece that might be best displayed standing up, we'll show you how do this as well. Finally, we'll show you how to create a puff pillow. In addition, feel free to bring any piece you plan to exhibit but are unsure how to finish. We will be glad to make suggestions.

Full instructions for registering your exhibit entries will be sent out via email or postal mail.

General Info

- **×** Each member can enter up to 10 pieces.
- ➤ When in doubt, register it! It is ok if you are unable to exhibit a piece you registered but you will NOT be able to add pieces after the registration deadline.
- ➤ The registration form asks for the costs of supplies and finishing and the number of stitching hours. This information is needed for the exhibit insurance that National provides. Rough estimates of time and money spent are sufficient.
- ➤ While we will not encourage photographs, we will not stop attendees from taking pictures. If you have a piece you don't want to be photographed, please don't enter it.

Registration forms for this year's exhibit will be available in several formats:

- ➤ Printed copies will be available at the March and April group meetings.

Needlework Closet Donations

Donations of new or gently used needlework-related items are now being accepted for sale at our *Artistry in Stitches* exhibit in May. Funds raised at the Needlework Closet help our Chapter offer special events like workshops with national teachers.

You may give your donations to me or to Terry Case at Beverwyck meetings, to Fran Roscello at Day Group, to Doris Halvorsen at North End, or to any study group leader.

We have a <u>Donations Guidelines</u> page on our website, and I encourage you to consult that list while going through your stash. Here are a few other helpful guidelines:

- ➤ Place kits, with directions, fabric and threads, into a closed plastic bag. Label it "Complete kit" if original kit supplies are included; "Stitching started"; or note if anything is missing (for example, "Missing fabric," "Missing metallic threads"). Kits that have never been opened do not need a label.
- ➤ Place stitching fabric in a plastic bag and identify size of piece, thread count, and type of fabric, if known.
- **✗** If more than one skein of yarn, package together and identify type if there is no label. **✗**
- Roll quilting fabrics (except for fat quarters) and wrap a paper band around the roll. Write type of fabric and measurements on the band (100% cotton, 45" w. 2 1/3 yards).

2025 June Retreat at Ararat Center

The 2025 June Retreat will be held June 6-8 at the Ararat Center in Greenville, a short drive south of Delmar. Our retreats follow a simple formula of stitch, chat, eat, and repeat. It's a luxury to stitch all day as you visit with friends, breaking only to enjoy delicous meals. If you need some fresh air you can hop outside and take a walk on the grounds. Or enjoy the beautiful view of the Catskills from the huge windows of the stitching room.

Our stitching room has incredible daylight, with huge windows on both sides of the very large room. We'll sit at our tables in one part of this space, and when the breakfast, lunch or dinner bell rings, we just get up and move to a different part of the room. The food is always extraordinary, and we are able to accommodate anyone with special dietary requests.

Dates: The retreat dates are Friday, June 6 through Sunday, June 9.

Location: Ararat Center in Greenville, NY, just off Route 32, 18 miles south of Delmar.

Meals: Meals start with dinner on Friday. Snacks will be served every evening. Coffee, tea, hot chocolate, juices and water are included and available throughout the day, often with fresh fruit. Breakfast and lunch are served on Sunday and the retreat will end at 3:00 pm Sunday.

Costs: The retreat costs include all meals and meal gratuities. Housekeeping gratuities are up to the individual participant.

• \$306 for a single; \$246 for a double; and \$222 for a triple.

In order to hold this event, we must have full payment from 12 members by April 9. So please don't delay and send in the registration coupon on page 9 with your payment.

Registration for day trippers will open once we meet the minimum number of weekend attendees. At that point, I will send out an email with meal costs and other details.
