# **June 2025 Retreat**

It's not too late to sign up for this summer's retreat. If you decide to attend, you need to call or text me, Helen O'Connor, before June 2 to let me know your check is in the mail.

The retreat will be held Friday, June 6 through Sunday, June 8 at the Ararat Center in Greenville, NY, just off Route 32, 18 miles south of Delmar. The site itself is beautiful, with a view of the Catskill Mountains. Our stitching room has incredible daylight, with huge windows on both sides of the very large room. The food is always extraordinary, and we are able to accommodate anyone with special dietary requests.

Again this year we're offering morning and afternoon breaks with "Simple Stretches for Stitchers," to be led by Ann Cohan and Helen O'Connor. Most of these stretches can be done in your chair and are designed to help with the aches and pains that can arrive after hours of sitting and stitching. If you need a break from stitching in the evenings, the main residence has a large, central living room with a television and DVD player.

Meals start with dinner on Friday. Coffee, tea, hot chocolate, juices and water are included and available throughout the day, often with fresh fruit. Breakfast and lunch are served on Sunday and the retreat will end at 3:00 pm Sunday.

Costs for Weekenders: Includes all meals and meal gratuities. Housekeeping gratuities are up to the individual participant.

Friday–Sunday: \$306 for a single; \$246 for a double; and \$222 for a triple.

Costs for Day Trippers: You need to pay for your meals plus the snack cost for any day you plan to attend. The snack cost includes the water, coffee, tea, hot chocolate, desserts, fruit, etc., that Ararat makes available for us. Meal prices include gratuities.

Breakfast – \$12.65 | Lunch – \$19.55 | Dinner – \$31.05 | Snacks \$4.60 per day

**You'll find the registration coupon on page 6.** Weekenders will need to choose their room preference and day trippers will need to indicate their day and meals.

# **Exhibit Update**

We finally had our long awaited 2025 Artistry in Stitches exhibition at Pat's Barn in Troy. The positive response from the public was gratifying, especially to the members who put in the long hours that made the exhibit such a success.

On Thursday evening members were invited to our exhibit preview party and had first dibs at our Needlework Closet on the second floor.

Friday was the busiest of the three days with 143 attendees. Saturday and Sunday saw 112 and 110 attendees respectively for a grand total of 365 visitors to Artistry in Stitches! The three days of demonstrations were all well attended, as was a first look at the NY panel, one of thirteen America's Tapestry panels celebrating the 250th anniversary of our nation's founding.

The Opportunity Baskets near the entry table were a big attraction, a good fund raiser along with the Needlework Closet on the second floor. We also had quite a few people express interest in joining EGA, attend meetings and hopefully become members.

Visitors told us they'd heard about the exhibit from various sources: newspaper articles, fliers, our EGA Facebook page, other guilds, needlework shops and our road signs, so all our advertising efforts paid off. They were also impressed with our new location, its accessibility, spacious displays, and all the goodies in our Needlework Closet.

Now, after the success of our current exhibit we can hopefully look forward to a future exhibit at Pat's Barn in 2027.

While we've gotten some initial stitching on the New York panel for America's Tapestry, we need to get stitching in earnest. The panel needs to be finished by the end of April 2026 so it (and the other 12 panels) can be put on display in time for the 250th anniversary of the United States.


I will bring the panel to the June retreat, so folks can stitch on it there. Then it will be set up at the Van Schaick Mansion, which has graciously offered to host us. let me know what day(s) and what times. At the very least, try to drop by on the 14th to check out the Van Schaick Mansion. I will warn folks: the Van Schaick Mansion was built in the mid-1700s. It is not ADA compliant: if you can't handle stairs, you won't be able to get inside to stitch.

I'll be surveying the membership in June to find out what days are best for folks to stitch. The people who run the Van Schaick Mansion will unlock the doors whenever we want to stitch. not just when they are open for events. We can pick either weekends or weekdays. Though as I still work, if folks want to stitch on weekdays, someone else will have to be in charge for the day. That mostly will be just making sure everyone who stitches signs in with name and time spent. The panel will be set up ready to go once the side lacings are tightened. Everything you need will be there: stitching guide, book of stitches (thanks, Maggie!), needles, floss, etc. Plan to bring scissors, as I won't promise to have more than a pair there. And since we're working on 32-count linen, you may also want to bring magnification.
