America's Tapestry: The New York Panel

We're in the homestretch, folks!

We have to be 100% completely and totally done by April 30th: stitching, fabric paint, appliques. Everything. All thirteen panels will be collected between May 1st and 4th, then delivered to the mounter in Washington, DC by May 5th. A month later, in June, the mounted panels will be shipped to Muscarelle Museum of Art for their first public exhibition. The Muscarelle is located on the campus of William & Mary College, near historic Williamsburg.



Our panel has so many different techniques. Above is the vignette in the upper left corner, one of the Birch Trial hearings. We've got surface embroidery, blackwork, gold couching, and even a leatherwork book. There is fabric painting for the background. And the wide-open space is where an applique will be added. All these different techniques combine to give the panel dimension and interest. *(Continued on page three.)*

America's Tapestry: The New York Panel (Continued from page one.)

While our drop-dead date is April 30th, our goal is to be done with the stitching by no later than March 31st. That gives us a month to sew on all the amazing appliques our talented members have made, touch up the fabric paint, and add any final stitches. We are well on the way to that goal, as you can see from this photo (right) showing the stitching as of January 19th, with most, but not all, of the appliques laid out.



The stitching left is mostly along the bottom edge: the buildings and the father in the boat. We still have to decide on what stitches to use for some of the buildings. If you want to share your thoughts about potential stitches to use, let me know. I'd love to hear from you.

I will be planning a week-long stitch-a-thon in late February or early March. We'll be stitching every day at the Van Schaick Mansion to try to reach our goal of finishing the stitched portion of the panel by March 31st (or perhaps a few days earlier!). The exhibition will include not only the panels themselves but also a list of everyone who has stitched on a panel, even if only for five minutes. Want to add your name to that list? Keep an eye out for the email looking for stitchers to carry us over the finish line.

Speaking of the Van Schaick Mansion, the Daughters of the American Revolution (our gracious hosts for the panel and our stitchers) have invited me to present at their next business meeting. And they have extended that invitation to any stitchers who would like to attend, as well. It will be held on Saturday, March 21st, and lunch is included. If you are interested, let me know, and I will share the details.

As mentioned above, the first public exhibition of all 13 panels of America's Tapestry will be at the Muscarelle Museum. The panels will then travel around, with the following locations already scheduled:

- Muscarelle Museum, VA (May 2026 – August 2026)
- Seton Hill University, PA (September 2026)
- Passaic County, NJ (October 2026 – December 2026)
- Millyard Museum, NH (January 2027 – April 2027)

If you want to see all 13 panels closer to home, the New York State Museum will be hosting the exhibition Winter 2027 through Spring 2028. Nearly 18 months after the New York Panel leaves the Van Schaick in May 2026, it will be back in Albany, with the other 12 panels. More details will be shared as that date gets closer.

As always, my heartfelt thanks to our core group of stitchers. Without the talent and enthusiasm you ladies bring to the project, this panel would not be nearly as far along as it is.

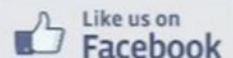

It's Nearly Here! June Retreat — 2026

The retreat will be held **Friday, June 12 through Sunday, June 14** at the Ararat Center in Greenville, NY, in Greene County. The site itself is beautiful, with a view of the Catskill Mountains. Our stitching room has incredible light, with large windows on both sides of a spacious room. If you need a break from stitching, the main residence has a large, central living room with a television and DVD player.

The food is always extraordinary, and they are able to accommodate anyone with special dietary needs. Meals start with dinner on Friday. Beverages are included and available throughout the day, often with fresh fruit. Saturday includes breakfast, lunch, dinner and snacks. Breakfast and lunch are served on Sunday and the retreat will end at 3:00 pm Sunday.

Weekenders: Includes all meals and meal gratuities. Housekeeping gratuities are up to the individual participant. Friday–Sunday: \$306 for a single; \$246 for a double; and \$222 for a triple.

Day Trippers: You need to pay for your meals plus the snack cost for any day you plan to attend. The snack cost includes the beverages, dessert, and fruit. Breakfast – \$12.65, Lunch – \$19.55, Dinner – \$31.05, Snacks – \$4.60 per day, gratuity included.

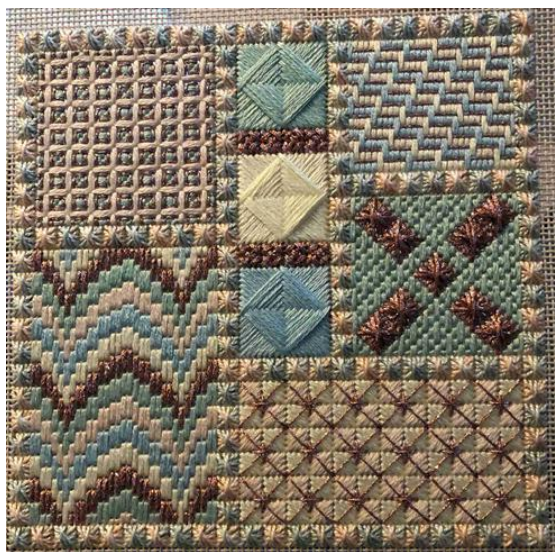
